Our bed is planted, and our gardeners have become involved in the S. Lincoln Street Garden group. Several of their members attended our Celebrate Our Gardens event on June 10.

Led by Tina DeLucchi, with help of Peggy Martin, Kay Rex and a growing roster of others as the summer bounty increases, we are harvesting the vegetable garden at the Mendocino Coast Botanical Garden and delivering the produce to the Food Bank weekly. #### **Our Educational Presentations**

For several years now, we have asked members at the April meeting for feedback on the monthly presentations at our meetings. We also ask what people most want to learn, and for other program ideas and speakers.

Members gave high marks to our seven monthly programs on garden insects, native plants, vegetable gardening, garden art and more. Members also requested more hands-on experiences. In response we held two very hands-on and somewhat hands-dirty classes.

In February, following her presentation on seeding, biodynamic gardener Sydney Grange helped us seed flats and pots with veggies, herbs and native plants for ourselves and our Plant Sale. Sydney also led classes in March on starting a vegetable garden that we presented at the S. Lincoln St. Garden where we are growing food for the Food Bank. At our March meeting, members made origami with pollinator seed-paper under the direction of member Alan Foss. Alan also held a weekend class at his home at which participants created seed paper and painted clay pots for our April sale.

## Sidewalk Gardens to Bragg About

We honored the winners of our annual *Sidewalk Gardens to Bragg About* contest at a new event, *Celebrate Our Gardens-A Dessert Gala* on Monday June 10. We complimented the Sidewalk Gardens contest this year with a *Celebrate Our Gardens Photo Contest* open to all gardeners from Westport to Elk. At the June 10<sup>th</sup> event we exhibited the photos and voted on a People's Choice Award. The event was attended by over 70 people including representatives of every garden-related organization in the area, from the school gardens to Mendocino Coast Botanical Gardens. We chose the occasion to present our donation of \$1200 to local Farm to School teaching organization, Noyo Food Forest, to support their Summer Garden Interns Program.
