## 2020 SIDEWALK GARDENS A SUCCESS

Fort Bragg Garden Club received dozens of nominations for its 11th Annual "Sidewalk Gardens to Bragg About" contest. Showcasing gardens large and small, the nominations reflected a wide range of styles, from formal manicured gardens to more casual natural settings.

The challenge was to choose just a few winners. Nine judges - all Garden Club members, some also Master Gardeners - viewed and evaluated the nominated gardens to narrow the field to eight finalists. Then, going out a second time, the judges determined the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners.

- 1<sup>st</sup> Place: **300 Perkins Way** was chosen for its flowing design, the variety of plants and artwork, and the incorporation of a vegetable garden.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place: **421 North Harbor Drive** worked with the landscape to overcome the adversity of the sloping site. It has a pleasing variety of plants and color, and is inviting to birds, bees, and butterflies.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place: **250 Wall Street** is an appealing garden that draws attention with its use of color, plants of varying heights and textures, and a lovely stone path.

- Fort Bragg Bee City Pollinator Garden Award: **932 Cedar Street.** The Fort Bragg Bee City USA Committee selected its second annual winner from nominees identified by the Gardens to Bragg About judges as pollinator friendly. In a statement from the Committee, Chairperson Cornelia Reynolds said: "This garden was chosen for its great variety of pollinator plants, including achillea, buddleia, pineapple sage, nicotiana, California poppies, nasturtiums and more."
- Mayor's Choice Award: **445 Winifred Street** is Will Lee's favorite, located on a block with many yards that gardeners find inspiring.
