<b>Visual Appeal</b> (initial reaction, overall impression, balance)	<b>Plant Variety and Health</b> (blooms, trees, shrubs)	<b>Design</b> (layout, color, form, texture, levels)	<b>Creativity</b> (special features, imaginative ideas, artwork)	<b>Maintenance</b> (cleanliness, neatness, weeded, deadheaded)	<b>Comments</b> (Example: drought tolerant, <b>pollinator friendly</b> , succulents, etc.)
