- Festive containers that will hold water
- Wire
- Greens (fresh) - any and all holiday greens.
- Berries - Heavenly Bamboo and Toyon are the best.
- Variegated Foliage - such as Euonymus, Eucalyptus, Curly Willow
- Leucadendron and Hydrangea blossoms
- Twigs, Pine Cones
- Tapered candles
- Small bird's nests, eggs, and other creative focals such as deer, Santas, stars, etc.



- Small, shiny ornaments that would fit into a centerpiece
- Ribbon
