Update on "Garden Friendly Community"

Garden Planned for CV Starr Center

You may remember Matt Drewno's presentation last year on starting community gardens in Fort Bragg. Last September City Council adopted a resolution of support and identified four possible sites for gardens. Due to Covid and bureaucracy, it took a year to evaluate the options and design a proposal for a garden at the preferred site, CV Starr Center. The garden plan on the south side of the building includes over 45 garden beds of various sizes, including eight ADA beds, a hoop-house, tool shed, composting bin, and four water tanks to be set up to collect rain. All paths will be ADA compliant. The landscape includes fruit trees and pollinator friendly herbs. Plots will be rented on an annual basis on a sliding scale.

The proposal was presented Monday to City Council, which expressed strong support. A resolution will be up for adoption at their next meeting.

The cost of an ADA compliant garden infrastructure is considerable; the total budget is over \$17,700. The committee has \$7,500 in seed money from the Mendocino Coast Children's Fund and is pursuing other foundation support. A Go Fund Me site has raised over \$2,000 to date.
